

WHAT MAKES AN ADA SIGN compliant?

A Tactile (raised text readable by touch) ADA Sign has basic requirements:

RAISED TEXT

Raised Characters

- Upper case **TEXT**
- Raised 1/32" min.
- Character Height: 5/8" - 2"
- Non-glare finish
- Contrast (light-on-dark or dark-on-light)
- San or "simple" serif

Character Style

HELVETICA

Character Style

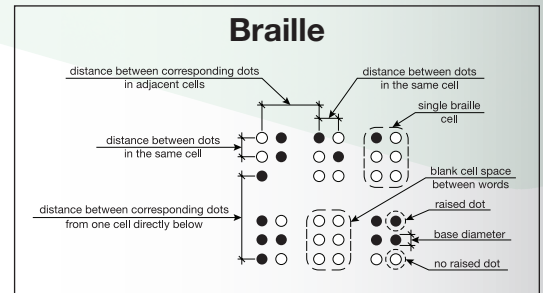
New standards specify "conventional form"

Prohibited:

Italic *Oblique* *script*
highly decorative
or other *unusual forms*

BRAILLE

- Cosco has certification to use Raster Grade 2 Braille
- Braille shall have a rounded or domed shape
- Braille is required to be directly below the raised text it translates. 3/8" min. - 1/2" max. spacing between the braille and raised text



HIGH COLOR CONTRAST

- Finish to be Non-Glare

- There is a minimum 6" field area when using pictograms
- A 6"x 6" ADA restroom sign would not be compliant
